Our Services

We talk a lot about the lives of the people we serve in Langley's Latest and the ways they are able to seize the opportunity to live rich, full lives. What you may not realize is exactly how Langley supports the individuals in our programs and the impact our programs make on their lives.

Langley works with each individual in our program on what is generally called life skills. The life skills we work with each individual on vary, but our main focus is supporting the individual to achieve a life where they can be as independent as possible. For some of the residents in our houses it may be working with hygiene reminders, packing lunch for the next day, cooking dinner or daily medication reminders. For our individuals in our community support program we work on things will grocery shopping, budgeting, including paying bills, and accompanying people to medical appointments. Having support in these areas of daily living enable the adults we serve to focus on maintaining

The Delmarva Foundation said Langley provides "outstanding service" to the individuals in our programs and particularly noted that the long standing relationships between the individuals and direct support staff greatly contribute to better outcomes for the individuals in our programs. Our counselors have been with us for a very long time, with the average full time counselor having worked at Langley for almost five years and the average part time counselor for over six years. In an industry that commonly faces high turn over, we are very proud to have wonderful staff who stay with us and work with our individuals to achieve their best possible outcomes!

The life skills we work with our individuals on help them achieve the life they want to lead. Thank you for supporting Langley and our counselors to help give everyone in our programs the tools they need to build a foundation of practices and habits that allow them to lead productive, rich, full lives.

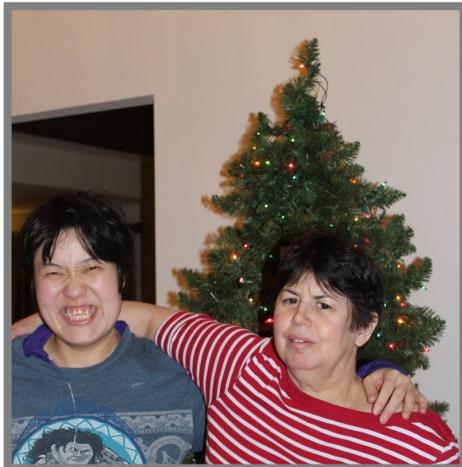
