Who We Are

At Langley Residential Support Services, we envision a world where everyone lives a rich, full life. One filled with independence, community, and purpose for all. Our mission is to serve adults with developmental disabilities, their families, and our community by providing quality, comprehensive residential and community support services.

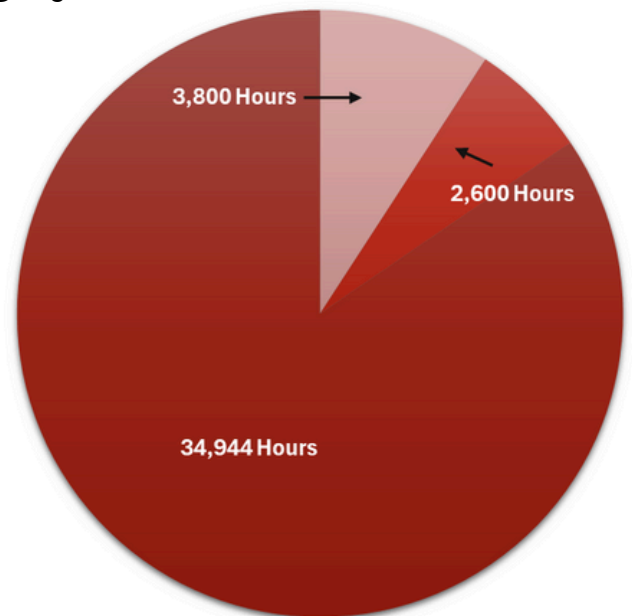
Founded in 1983 by members of Trinity United Methodist Church, Immanuel Presbyterian Church, and Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, Langley is a supportive community for adults with developmental disabilities to gain independence and foster community in Fairfax County, Virginia. 1985 we established our residential support program by opening our first group home. Since then, Langley has grown to encompass five group homes, with a sixth opening in June 2024. Our group homes mirror life in the homes of most adults, with family dinners, shared chores, and lifelong relationships. In the 1990s, we expanded our services to the community by opening our community support program, which helps those who need moderate help in daily life and benefits from the help of an advocate working on their behalf in certain instances.

For over forty years, we have supported over a hundred adults with developmental disabilities to live a rich, full life. Individuals in our programs flourish. Some of the 44 individuals we serve have been with Langley for decades, and some for their adult lives. With a lifelong commitment to those we serve, Langley is not just a service provider - we are home.
